BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS: Youth Service America is a nonprofit organization that works to empower youth organizations in communities across America for engagement. The organization has ongoing micro grants that are available to any youth organization in the U.S. for an array of different purposes.

Currently, there is one available grant and one soon to be available one that could be sought by the City Youth Council to tackle issues of hunger in the community. The first grant is the *Sodexo Stop Hunger Grant* which has an application deadline of January 25, 2026. The grant awards up to \$1,000 for youth-led projects that target childhood hunger in the community.

A grant that opens in January 2026, the Hershey Heartwarming Young Heroes Grants, provides \$250 or \$500 for youth service projects.

One or more youth council members could volunteer to work on either grant to complete it on behalf of the council. Either individual or teams can come up with the project plan for their respective grants for presentation to the council as a whole at the January meeting before applying.
